INTRODUCTION

- The art of teaching is a <u>complex process</u>, which is not limited to transferring of knowledge from one to another.
- It requires good <u>verbal and non-verbal</u> skills. It includes various techniques in order to transfer knowledge effectively.
- With the vast growth in all sectors, <u>effective teaching skills</u> are in great demand. Therefore, due to this demand, the concept of micro teaching came into action.
- It is a <u>new innovative program</u> for teachers, which enhances their classroom attitude and behaviour.

FEATURES OF MICRO-TEACHING

Micro-teaching is relatively a new innovation in the field of teacher education

- Real teaching: Micro-teaching is real teaching but focuses on developing teaching skills.
- Scaled down teaching: Micro-teaching is a scaled down teaching:
 (i) To reduce the class size to 5-10 pupils.
 (ii) To reduce the duration of period to 5-10 minutes.
 (iii) To reduce the size of the lesson.
- (iv) To reduce the teaching skill.

• INSTRUCTIONAL CLOSURE – Instructional closure is reached when the lesson is completed and the teacher shows the link between past knowledge and the new knowledge.

• COGNITIVE CLOSURE – Cognitive closure is reached when the students have reached closure and have made the link between old and new knowledge.

• **SOCIAL CLOSURE** – Social closure is the act of giving pupils a feeling of achievement after a lesson and encouraging them to continue to strive and make improvements.
