Definition of Guidance


- Ruth Strang, "Guidance is a process of helping every individual, through his own efforts, to discover and develop his potentialities for his personal happiness and social usefulness."

There are primarily three types of guidance > Personal Guidance Educational Guidance Vocational Guidance








Personal Guidance:

Personal guidance deals with the problems of personal adjustment in different spheres of life. Mainly it works for the individuals adjustment to his social and emotional problems. Jones has put the following aims of personal guidance :

(i) to assist the individual gradually to develop his life goals that are socially desirable and individually satisfying.

(ii) to help him to plan his life so that these goals may be attained



- (iii) to help him grow consistently in ability to adjust himself creatively to his developing life goals.
- (iv) to assist the individual to grow consistently in ability to live with others so effectively that he may promote their development and his own worthy purposes.
- (v) to help him grow in self-directive ability
- Thus the goal of personal guidance is selfdirective and self realisation


Educational Guidance

Educational Guidance:

 It is a process concerned with bringing about a favorable setting for the individual's education and includes the assistance in the choice of subjects, use of libraries, laboratories. workshops, development of effective study habits, evaluation techniques and adjustment of school life with other activities.



- Educational guidance is intended to aid the individual choosing a proper educational programme and making progress in it. This involves:
- i) Knowledge of the abilities and interests of the individual.
- ii) Knowledge of a wide range of educational opportunities and
- iii) Programmes of counseling to help the individual to choose wisely on the basis of the above two kinds of knowledge.



Vocational guidance is the assistance given to students in choosing and preparing for a suitable vocation. It is concerned primarily with helping individuals make decision and choices involved in planning future and a career decision and choices necessary in effecting satisfactory vocational adjustment.

Vocational guidance would assist an individual in solving these problems.

Vocational guidance is sometimes described as the process of "fitting round pegs in round holes and square page in square holes."

According to 'Crow and Crow' "Vocational Guidance usually is interpreted as the assistance given to the learners to choose, prepare for and progress in an occupation."

According to 'Myers', "Vocational Guidance is the process of assisting the individual to do for himself certain definite things pertaining to his vocation."



- Vocational Guidance: It is the assistance rendered in meeting the problems :
- (i) relating to the choice of vocation
- (ii) preparing for it
- (iii) entering the job, and
- (iv) achieving adjustment to it.
